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In Christian Studies, the students will continue to explore the basic belief systems of the Jewish, Islamic, and Christian faiths, describing the similarities and differences between these monotheistic religions in an information report writing assessment piece. They will then move on to investigating and illustrating the full nature of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Through a series of focused questions students will investigate the nature of the trinity and explore how God reveals himself to us.

In English, the writing focus will be narrative writing and procedural writing to tie in with our Humanities and Social Sciences and Digital Technologies units. The students will continue with the *Daily 5* program which will cover writing, spelling and reading. Finally, there will be informal opportunities for the students to develop their public speaking and presentation skills, as well as a formal opportunity based around the Learning Expo on Wednesday 21 August.

In Integrated Studies, the students will study the key institutions of Australia's democratic government, including state/territory and federal parliaments, and the responsibilities of electors and representatives. They will learn how state/territory and federal laws are made in a parliamentary system. Finally, they will examine Australian citizenship and reflect on the rights and responsibilities that being a citizen entails, and explore the obligations that people may have as global citizens.

Our Science unit this term will continue to focus on Biological Sciences. The students will be investigating micro-organisms and learning how some can be helpful and some can be harmful. Students will be conducting investigations that help them understand the role of micro-organisms in food. They will develop an understanding of the conditions micro-organisms need to grow, and research the development of penicillin. The students will then look at earthquakes and how they happen, as well as how they cause dramatic changes in the Earth's surface. They will also gain a greater understanding of how scientists measure and record the severity of earthquakes, and the effect they have on millions of lives.

Students are reminded that they are required to check and pack their schoolbags daily so that they are organised with the necessary items to begin each day. They will need to bring a **freshly filled water bottle** and **hat** each day, especially on Tuesday which is our P.E. day. They should bring a suitable bag for borrowing library books on a Thursday.

Students are also encouraged to participate in *Crunch and Sip* around 9:30am, especially now as the students do not eat morning tea until 11:20am, and also to remember our school's *Peanut and Tree Nut Free Zone Policy*.

Students are reminded to wear correct formal uniform on Mondays and Thursdays, with sport uniform to be worn on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

Parents are also reminded that the school's expectation/procedure for any student departing early is that the student needs to be collected from their classroom with an early departure slip received from the front office. This departure slip needs to be given to one of the teachers [or the specialist teacher] as per our duty of care.

We are really excited about the variety of activities that this term holds, and the wonderful experiences the students will be exposed to.
