INSIDE STORY: Music

Students in Year 1, 2 and 3 have begun a new unit in Music – ukulele! We are using colours to represent the different strings and will eventually be learning how to read these notes on the staff. Year 1 have begun learning how to hold the instrument properly, how to make sounds and have been playing simple rhythms on different strings. They listen, say, then play! Year 2 have begun learning simple songs using two strings. They have used their aural skills to listen first to be able to work out which song we are learning. Year 3 have continued on from their ukulele unit from last year, and revised the two coloured strings. We will now introduce a third and then a fourth string to be able to play many more songs.
