 Only students who raise the minimum of \$15 will be allowed to participate. Those who don't raise the required amount will be supervised in a classroom and continue with school work assigned by respective year level teachers.

- Each child who raises the minimum of \$15 sponsorship will receive a colour coded "ninja headband" which will be worn for the event, they will enjoy the challenges on our ninja run course (which includes a 25m inflatable obstacle course), and on completion of the run they will get to enjoy an ice block.
- The course will be comprised of a variety of obstacles including the 25m inflatable obstacle course.
