Term 1 School Fee Accounts have been uploaded to Parent Lounge.


To access the statement please follow the following steps:

FROM THE HEAD OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

Here at St Paul's, we are proud to promote a love of reading. Students have lots of opportunities to read throughout their week at school. Students borrow their choice of Library books each week from the GLAD Centre, they use Home Readers to practice their reading skills at their specific developmental level, and they read to self and to their peers during Daily 5. While the skills of decoding, comprehending and synthesising information are important to growing great readers, developing a love of reading is equally as important.

Dr Jennifer Rennie (a Senior Lecturer at Monash University and President of the Australian Literacy Educator's Association) argues that reading for pleasure "allows us to imagine, it sparks creativity and allows us to explore ideas and issues in a safe way." Along with these benefits, Dr Rennie also says that "Reading is also relaxing, it allows us to take ourselves away from the stresses of life."



Reading with your child has so many benefits! I encourage you to read with your child each day and find texts that you simply **enjoy** reading together. Here are some ideas to get you started: an interesting newspaper article, the latest camping catalogue, joke books, old family letters and albums, recipes, novels, picture books, comics, scientific diagrams and eye spy books.
