PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers

Under His Wings

He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge. Psalm 91:4

When I think of protection, I don't automatically think of a bird's feathers. Though a bird's feathers might seem like a flimsy form of protection, there is more to them than meets the eve.



Bird feathers are an amazing example of God's design.

Feathers have a smooth part and a fluffy part. The smooth part of the feather has stiff barbs with tiny hooks that lock together like the prongs of a zipper. The fluffy part keeps a bird warm. Together both parts of the feather protect the bird from wind and rain. But many baby birds are covered in a fluffy down and their feathers haven't fully developed. So a mother bird has to cover them in the nest with her own feathers to protect them from wind and rain.

The image of God "[covering] us with his feathers' in Psalm 91:4 and in other Bible passages is one of comfort and protection. The image that comes to mind is a mother bird covering her little ones with feathers. Like a parent whose arms are a safe place to retreat from a scary storm or a hurt, God's comforting presence provides safety and protection from life's emotional storms.

Though we go through trouble and heartache, we can face them without fear as long as our faces are turned toward God. He is our "refuge".

Father God, help me trust that You are bigger than any fear I have. When fear causes hope to fade, flee to God, the refuge you can reach on your knees.

As we head towards the middle of Term 1 and settle further into our classroom and learning routines, I would like to thank you for your wonderful support, words of affirmation and encouragement, feedback and attendance at various school events. A comment which was shared with me a fortnight ago after the Parent Information Evenings, was about how great the learning spaces are and how fortunate the students are to be part of their respective learning environments. "I wish I could do school all over again!" was the comment which came from this information. In light of this feedback, I have included for your information and interest this week an attachment giving you some background information to the philosophy which now underpins the Agile Learning Spaces and the furniture used in them as the "third teacher" at St Paul's.



Thank you to our Year 5 students for the rich and very relevant 20/20 Vision School Sunday which they shared with us on the weekend. They have to be commended on the variety of items used to share their message with us - singing, skits, Bible readings and prayers were the order of the day! The students' confidence and willingness to take a risk speaks volumes of their growth mindset and bodes well for this group as they learn, live and play together. This timeframe allows both the students and teachers to review and revisit their learning journey during the April term break, thereby ensuring that the inquiry journey continues smoothly at the start of the new term. The processes and topics for each year level's deep Inquiry Unit will be on display in the main undercover area, starting next week, for the following 10 weeks. Please drop in to read about the learning happening throughout the school.

Staff news: It's with a heavy heart that Mrs. Jacquie Delroy informed me last week that she has been advised by her doctors to step away, with immediate effect, from her teaching job for the remainder of 2020. A parent/legal guardian <u>must</u> attend the examination appointment. This is so that you can be involved in making decisions about your child's oral health care and discuss any issues that may be of concern.

Please remember to bring your child's Medicare Card to every appointment.
