Let those who wept as they planted their crops, gather the harvest with joy! Those who wept as they went out carrying the seed will come back singing for joy, as they bring in the harvest. (verses 5, 6)

If you are a farmer, you may understand better than others the painful and stressful burden of planting seed in faith that you will receive the right weather patterns for a good crop. But you don't need to be a farmer to relate to this passage.

Parents struggle with the often painful and endless routine of cooking and cleaning for their children and teaching them, often with little immediate result. Only later in life will they see any fruit for their labours. Pastors and church workers work hard to sow the seed of the gospel, only to see too many people choked by the weeds of greed, self-glory and selfishness.

2019 School Fees

The School Council & Finance Committee has approved the Business Office draft budget for 2019. The school fees for 2019 have increased 1% from 2018 levels.

This represents a \$50 yearly increase for the first student (approx. 96 cents per week) and a \$35 yearly increase for the second child (approx. 67 cents per week). The Business Office has prepared a 2019 fee schedule that has gone out. These can also be collected form Reception.

The School Executive & School Council are aware of the increasing costs in households, and as such, we have attempted to keep the fee increases to a minimum.

Please remember that as the end of the year approaches, 2018 fees need to be finalised. Reminders will be going out in the coming weeks. If you are having difficulty meeting the deadlines for 2018 fees, please contact the Business Office.
