






FROM THE HEAD OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

RAILTRAIL

CABOOLTURE TO WAMURAN



Lace-up your walking shoes and explore the first stage of the new trail which provides a 2.5 kilometre link from Beerburrum Road to Bluebell Park, Caboolture.

The three-stage rail trail project will ultimately provide 10.5 kilometres of shared pathway from Beerburrum Road, Caboolture to Atwood Street, Wamuran.

The trail follows the Caboolture to Kilcoy railway corridor decommissioned in the 1960s, showcasing the history of the railway and providing a recreational connection for pedestrians and cyclists.
