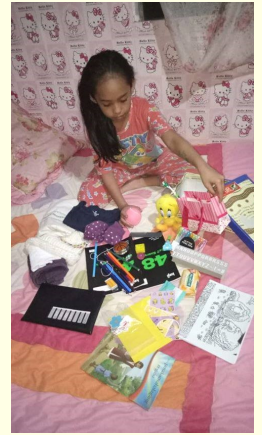
Service Project Term 3 2018

Containers for Change

St Paul's is commencing a new initiative called 'Containers for Change' which will have wheelie bins situated around the school (one in the Junior school, one in the Senior school and one for our school community) to drop off containers which can be returned for cash. With this newsletter, I have included a list of the items we are able to collect and encourage our school community to support us with this venture.

Recycling efforts are focused on drinks generally consumed away from home (eg. soft drinks, water bottles, small flavoured milk). Drink containers generally consumed only at home (eg. cordial, plain milk, wine and spirit bottles, condiments and cleaning) are excluded.

Be sure that the containers are empty and have the caps off.

Squashed cans and bottles can only be refunded at over-the-counter depots (eg. visually verify they are eligible).

RAIL-TRAIL CABOOLTURE TO WAMURAN



Lace-up your walking shoes and explore the first stage of the new trail which provides a 2.5 kilometre link from Beerburum Road to Bluebell Park, Caboolture.

The three-stage rail trail project will ultimately provide 10.5 kilometres of shared pathway from Beerburum Road, Caboolture to Atwood Street, Wamuran.

The trail follows the Caboolture to Kilcoy railway corridor decommissioned in the 1960s, showcasing the history of the railway and providing a recreational connection for pedestrians and cyclists.
