Dear Parents and Caregivers of Year 6 Students

Welcome back to Term 2. We hope that every family had a safe and relaxing holiday, and that you are all energized for this exciting term!

In Christian Studies, we will be exploring the basic belief systems of the Jewish, Islamic, and Christian faiths. This unit will also ask students to describe the similarities and differences between these monotheistic religions.

In English, our writing focus will be information report writing and poetry writing to tie in with our Humanities and Social Sciences and Christian Studies units, and we will begin to examine procedural writing and persuasive writing. We will continue with our *Daily 5* program which will cover writing, spelling and reading. Finally, we will have formal and informal opportunities for the students to develop their public speaking and presentation skills.

For our Integrated Studies unit, the students will continue to explore the diverse environments, peoples and cultures within the Asia region, and examine Australia's various connections with other countries and places throughout the world. The students will then begin to study the key institutions of Australia's democratic government, including state/territory and federal parliaments, and the responsibilities of electors and representatives.

Our Science unit this term will focus on Biological Sciences. The students will be investigating micro-organisms and learning how some can be helpful and some can be harmful. Students will be conducting investigations that help them understand the role of micro-organisms in food and medicine. They will develop an understanding the conditions micro-organisms need to grow, learn about the yeast and bread making process and research the development of penicillin.

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Students are reminded that they are required to check and pack their schoolbags daily so that they are organised with the necessary items to begin each day. They will need to bring a **freshly filled water bottle** and **hat** each day, especially on Tuesday which is our P.E. day. They should bring a suitable bag for borrowing library books on a Thursday.

Students are also encouraged to participate in 'Crunch and Sip' around 9:30am, and also to remember our school's 'Peanut and Tree Nut Free Zone' Policy.

Students are reminded to wear correct formal uniform on Mondays and Thursdays, with sport uniform to be worn on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

There continues to be a strong emphasis placed on presentation of work in class as well as tasks to be completed at home. If work presented is unsatisfactory students will be required to redo it.

Parents are also reminded that the school's expectation/procedure for any student departing early is that the student needs to be collected from their classroom with an early departure slip received from the front office. This departure slip needs to be given to one of the teachers [or the specialist teacher] as per our duty of care.
