PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Caregivers

Forgive us our sins

'The servant did not have enough to pay his debt, so the king ordered him to be sold as a slave, with his wife and his children and all that he had, in order to pay the debt. The servant fell on his knees before the king. "Be patient with me," he begged, "and I will pay you everything!" The king felt sorry for him, so he forgave him the debt and let him go.' (verses 25-27)



God expects us to forgive each other. Just as the king in this story had mercy on his servant, and let him go, so we must forgive those who sin against us – even if they sin against us more times than we can count!

This may seem like an impossible sort of teaching to accept. That's because, humanly speaking, it is. But think about it this way: if God expects you, an imperfect human being, to keep on forgiving those who hurt you, then how much more will he, who is perfect, forgive you when you ask him for mercy!

It's an amazing thing: as you receive God's mercy and forgiveness, he changes you into someone who can share his mercy and forgiveness with those who hurt you.

Prayer: Father, forgive me my sins, as I forgive those who sin against me. Amen.



Junior Japanese

This week in Junior Japanese we have been learning about the sakura (cherry blossom) festival, hanami. Cherry blossom festivals are an important custom and are held all over Japan during the spring. The students designed and decorated their own sakura trees. These are displayed in the Japanese classroom. I invite you to come and see our beautiful display.



Senior Japanese

Last week in Senior Japanese class we learnt about the Hanami festival in Japan. We watched a very interesting video that taught us many Japanese key words in which the Japanese people use to describe the sakura (cherry blossom) trees. We drew our own sakura tree and wrote the Japanese key words on the branches of the tree. They look sugoi (amazing)! We are also learning eight classroom instructions which help us to understand classroom directions from Miller Sensei.

- These include: *Mou ichido kudasai (One more time please);
 - *Shizuki ni shite kudasai (Please be quiet);
 - *Mite kudasai (Please look);
 - *Kaite kudasai (Please write);
 - *Akete kudasai (Please open);
 - *Te o agete kudasai (Please raise your hand);
 - *Yonde kudasai (Please read);
 - *Kiite kudasai (Please listen).

We have also been studying an enquiry unit about the geography of Japan.

- These are our key questions: *a) Where is Japan?*
- b) What does Japan look like?
- c) What are some customs of Japan?

It would be great if you could please have a

conversation with your child about the wonderful things that we are learning in Senior Japanese class each week. For example, ask them to sing for you the 'Japanese Classroom Instruction song' this Thursday, which is to the tune of "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star."
