We are taking enrolments for 2020, please collect an enrolment pack from Kindy and return to us as soon as possible to secure a place.

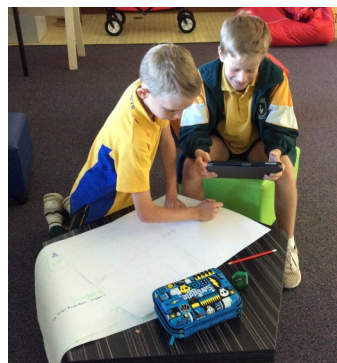

RSPCA Cat Glove Toy Making Instructions



Thanks so much for volunteering to help – our cats and kittens will really love their new glove toys!

To make a cat glove toy you will need:

- A glove
- 5 small cat toys
- Ribbon or string
- Needle and thread

How to make a cat glove toy:

1. Cut the ribbon in to 5 pieces (approx. 50cm each)
2. Sew these onto the finger tips of the glove but make sure that you don't sew the tips of the glove closed!
3. Sew, tie or attach one of the small cat toys onto the end of each piece of ribbon.
4. Your toy is ready to give one of our cats or kittens a great playtime!
