## Christ's light shines

The Christian Church, worldwide, celebrated its birthday on Sunday. Our Church, Christ's family, was born when Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to live in each person that believes in him. This is quite a mystery! The Bible describes the Spirit as a dove or flame. I have a treasured painting in my office which shows the spirit breaking out of darkness into places where Christ's light shines. The Cross is in the background. We also believe the Spirit takes us, Christ lights that we are, into the darkest places.

John's Gospel describes the arrival of the Holy Spirit:

"<sup>19</sup>The disciples were afraid of the Jewish leaders, and on the evening of that same Sunday they locked themselves in a room. Suddenly, Jesus appeared in the middle of the group. He greeted them <sup>20</sup>and showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they became very happy. <sup>21</sup>After Jesus had greeted them again, he said, "I am sending you, just as the Father has sent me." <sup>22</sup>Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup>If you forgive anyone's sins, they will be forgiven." ### Easter Garden

Have you noticed the cloth on the centre cross in our Easter Garden has been changed to red? This is because last Sunday we celebrated Pentecost. Ten days after Jesus ascended into heaven, the twelve apostles, Jesus' mother and family, and many other disciples gathered together in Jerusalem for the Jewish harvest festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover. While they were praying, a sound like rushing wind filled the house, and tongues of fire came to rest over each of their heads. This was the outpouring of the Holy Spirit promised by God. The disciples were immediately empowered to proclaim the gospel of the risen Christ.

Jesus promised to send a special helper. Jesus would be with us as the Holy Spirit, like a special friend inside giving help and strength. The Holy Spirit came as little flames.

Pentecost means fiftieth day and is celebrated fifty days after Easter. The liturgical colour for this day is red. This not only symbolises the tongues of flame in which the Holy Spirit descended, but also reminds us of the blood of the martyrs – believers of every generation who, by the power of the Holy Spirit, hold firm to their faith.

### Cat Rolling Musical Toy Instructions



Thanks so much for volunteering to help – our cats and kittens will really love their new musical toys!

#### To make a rolling musical toy you will need:

- Empty cardboard spool or tube
- Scraps of twine
- Different textured ribbon
- A little bell
- Glue

#### How to make a cat glove toy:

1. Attach the bell to a loop of ribbon, then thread it through the middle of the spool and tie it securely, using a bit of glue to fasten it.
2. Glueing the twine here and there, wind it around the spool. Pay attention to leave the ribbon with the bell free so it can still move.
3. Glue the scraps of ribbon around the spool, diagonally over the twine. This gives the toy different colours and textures to make it more interesting.
4. Now your musical toy is ready to cheer up one of our cats or kittens waiting to find their forever home.
