Lost Property

Please check the Lost Property Box for any items that may have been misplaced. It is important that ALL belongings are clearly named. This means that if any item does go missing it can be returned to the right owner. **Any items left in the Lost Property Box at the end of term will be disposed of.**

Hair

Please remember the following, which is taken directly out of the Parent Handbook, when having haircuts over the holiday period;

Hair is to be kept neat and tidy **without colour, spikes or tails**. Long hair past collar length must be tied back and longer fringes over eyebrow must be secured off the face. **Cuts should not be shorter than Number 3**. There are to be no severe undercuts, tracks or patterns. No hair products (eg. Gel, mousse, etc) are to be used. This applies to both girls and boys.

School Shoes

The school holidays are a good time to check the state of your student's shoes. If buying new ones, please remember that plain black lace-up school shoes are to be worn with the formal uniform and plain white lace-up joggers with the sports uniform.

Friday 20 September - Free Dress Day Gold Coin Fundraiser for the shoe box appeal - Final Day of Term 3



Guidelines :

At various times, Free Dress Days are held. Students are required to donate a gold coin/item for the privilege of wearing free dress. Students may wear a uniform if they prefer but are encouraged to still donate to the cause.

The following rules apply:

1. Shorts may be worn; however, these must be of a mid-thigh length (hems reaching tips of fingers when arms are by your side).
2. Shirts need to have a sleeve, have a modest neckline, and extend past the waist (no singlet tops, bare-shouldered shirts, or midriff tops). Slogans and words should be appropriate to the school ethos.
3. Free Dress Day/Camp is not a fashion parade. Students must be neat and tidy and suitably dressed for all classes and activities undertaken.
4. Fully enclosed shoes covering the tops of the feet **MUST** be worn and can include sandshoes, joggers, and skate shoes. **NO** sandals, backless shoes, or thongs. Thongs may be worn for showering only at camp.
5. The wearing of jewellery should conform to normal uniform requirements – watch only and plain studs or sleeper earrings.
6. Hair must be tied up if it touches collar or falls across the student's face as per normal uniform requirements.
7. Students inappropriately dressed on Free Dress Day will need to sit at the school office until appropriate clothing can be delivered by a parent or asked to change if on a camp.
8. Students may choose to wear their uniform, but it must be worn correctly. If wearing uniform hair must remain up and no extra jewellery may be worn.

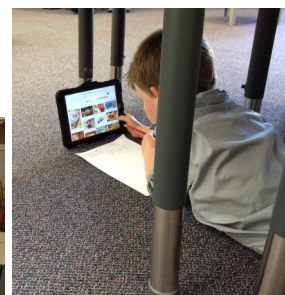
CELEBRATING STUDENTS AWARDS
