INSIDE STORY: Year 5

During Semester 1 in Visual Art, the Year 5 students have explored self-portraits, following the theme 'Faces of the Fifth Grade'. The students had an exciting time discovering how artists produced different representations of their self-portraits through a range of art styles and modes.

For their final self-portrait, the students investigated Synthetic and Analytical Cubism, specifically artworks by Spanish artist Pablo Picasso. The art style of Cubism allowed the students to explore how artists used geometric shapes, line and different viewpoints to create an abstract interpretation of people.



Students also practised using line, shape, colour and shading displayed in Synthetic and Analytical Cubism through drawings and written comparisons.

This week, the students had an enjoyable time finalising their cubist selfportraits, and were enthusiastic to demonstrate their understanding and personal tastes of the art style.
