

Hair Expectations – taken from Parent Handbook

Hair is to be kept neat and tidy without colour, spikes or tails. Long hair past collar length must be tied back and longer fringes over eyebrow must be secured off the face. INSIDE STORY: YEAR 3

The Year 3s have been learning about living on a spinning planet and what changes happen to shadows because of Earth's rotation. They set up a "Shadow Man" experiment, which unfortunately took flight due to it being a very windy day so a search began for a "Shadow Man" that would not be blown away in the wind. In stepped Mr Smith to take on this role and thanks to him we were able to look at and discuss the changes that happen to shadows. The Year 3s discovered that the shadow falls to the opposite side from which the sun is positioned and that shadows decrease in length from morning through to midday and increase in length from midday through to the afternoon. They also found out that midday is when shadows are at their shortest.
