WHAT DOES THE WORLD MEAN TO YOU?

Read John 16:25

What does the world mean to you? Is it about a good job, successful relationships, moving ahead, a happy family? Perhaps you consider it but a short stay before eternity. Perhaps you hope for an easy life and no troubles. Yet, Jesus tells us plainly: in this world, you will have troubles!

So what does God think of this world? Quite a bit, it seems. God looked at everything he had made, and it was very good (Genesis 1:31). God loved

the world enough to send the Son into it (John 1 and 3). Christ was involved in the creation of all things (Colossians 1), and this includes the world and all in it.

So why would Jesus say we will have troubles in this world? In this perfect, blessed and holy creation? Perhaps it's the 'we', or 'you', part of it. The human side of things. The desire to have more and get more, pushing aside others in our quest to do so (perhaps not literally, but still). The almost innate need to put me first, and in doing so, to hinder or hurt others. Our consumption habits show that here in Australia, we used up our share of the earth's resources for the year by 22 March. Mmm, the human side of things seems to equal troubles!

So what do we do? Wrong question! But also the right one! Under our own steam, we can't get rid of our troubles. Yet we can't just continue the way we are going and say God is in charge – no problems. Yes, God is in charge, and Jesus reassures us that he has defeated the world. But the craziness of God is that he chooses to work through us. That's why Christ lives in us. That's why the Holy Spirit empowers us – to trust in God but also live and act as his people, to whom the world is precious like it is to God.

Perhaps reflecting on the world as God's creation, as very good, as a gift, as 'all things made through Christ and for Christ' (Colossians 1:16) might encourage us to look at the world differently. Yes, there are troubles, and we will experience troubles, but we can recognise through God's grace that we are part of the problem and part of the solution. As Jesus has defeated the world, we live in and under his care.

Defeater of the world, help us not to be overcome by the troubles we experience in this world. Rather, help us turn to you, be reformed and renewed as your people who live under your care. Amen.

Easter Garden

This week the cloth on the centre cross in our Easter Garden has been changed to red. This is because last Sunday we celebrated Pentecost.

Ten days after Jesus ascended into heaven, the twelve apostles, Jesus' mother and family, and many other disciples gathered

in Jerusalem for the Jewish harvest festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover. While they were praying, a sound like rushing wind filled the house, and tongues of fire came to rest over each of their heads. This was the outpouring of the Holy Spirit promised by God. The disciples were immediately empowered to proclaim the gospel of the risen Christ.

Jesus promised to send a special helper. Jesus would be with us as the Holy Spirit, like a special friend inside giving help and strength. The Holy Spirit came as little flames.

Pentecost means fiftieth day and is celebrated fifty days after Easter. The liturgical colour for this day is red. This not only symbolises the tongues of flame in which the Holy Spirit descended, but also reminds us of the blood of the martyrs – believers of every generation who, by the power of the Holy Spirit, hold firm to their faith.

INSIDE STORY: Inquiry Skills in the GLAD Centre



Prep students have been looking at the differences between Fiction and Non-Fiction books and where these are found in the library. They have learned that fiction books have a beginning, middle and end, characters, setting, problem, and solution. A nonfiction book contains facts and information.



Year 1 are learning how to find information in a Non-Fiction book. They are examining the contents, index page and looking at text features and how these help the reader make sense of what they are reading.

Year 2 have been looking at different informational texts to identify the main idea and the key details; the important pieces of information that support the main idea of a text.



Year 3 have been practising skimming and scanning. These reading strategies are helpful to use when trying to find out the general idea of a piece of text or trying to locate specific information. Students have also looked at some safe ways to search on the internet.

Year 4 have been looking at different ways to organise and manage the information they find when researching e.g., note taking, mind maps, and graphic organisers.



Year 5 have been fine tuning their summary writing skills. Students have practised identifying what makes good summary vs a bad summary.

Year 6 have been looking at different search strategies and how to evaluate websites.
