Friday 25 June Student Free Day When Jesus taught his disciples new rules for life, he made some people really wonder if he had gone mad. His teaching often got him into trouble, especially when his words clashed with the religious establishment. They did not like to be challenged or made out to be wrong.

But one day he said, "Happy are the meek, for they will inherit the earth" (Matthew 5:5). Another meaning is happy are those who are humble. If we mention the word 'meek' we usually associate it with words like 'having no backbone' or 'a pushover'. Or someone who is shy and apologetic, over-modest or who gets treated like a doormat.



But that's not really as it is. Meekness is a poised humility, a quiet confidence generated out of trusting something to be true. And the Christian life offers something strong and true, a guide for life that is strong and stable.

The Bible tells us this in James 4:10, "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up". Some people don't like hearing that because they think humbling themselves leaves them open to ridicule of being weak. Maybe you've said to yourself, I don't need that teaching—I have enough personality and talent to make it through life on my own. I can look after myself, and can achieve my ambitions and make a difference in the world." You don't need this humility stuff.

Jesus, Our Model of Humility

Being a Christian is all about following Jesus, the one who laid down his life for us. It is all about knowing him, trusting and obeying him, and becoming like him. We need to understand the humility of Jesus. He said,

"Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble at heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

Jesus was a real man who had plenty of fire and courage—he wasn't a soft wuss of a guy. He cleaned the temple out with a whip and told the religious leaders they were a nest of snakes. His humility didn't mean he was passive and always softly spoken.

To be humble means to recognise we are not self-sufficient, rather that we depend on God for all we need. All we have, comes from him: our lives, our salvation, our hope, our strengths and abilities. Everything is given by God and nothing is our own.

How Do We Measure Effort at St Paul's?

Our teachers spent Term 3 of last year working on Action Research projects in collaborative teams. One of the staff teams focused on our school effort rubrics. They surveyed the staff, looked at research around mindset and effort (from Carol Dwek) and gave drafts for staff to review and give feedback on. From the start of this year, we have had a Senior and a Junior Effort rubric. You may have seen these colourful and clear statements around your child's learning space. Clear and transparent conversations have happened with students to help them really understand what effort looks like. There are four main areas for effort: Independent Work, Work Quality, Group Work and Perseverance. These four areas are marked on a four-point scale with the following words: Needs Improvement, Satisfactory, Good and Excellent. I invite you to have a chat with your child about what effort looks like and how they think they are going with their effort. I also invite you to come into our Learning Spaces and see the effort rubrics for yourself. The rubrics are written using student friendly language and start with the statement 'I can...'


