Hope is a feeling or a desire that something will happen.

Hope. It's a simple word and yet can **mean** so much to anyone going through a difficult time. It can **mean** the difference between hanging on and giving up. **Hope** can **mean** anything you want it to. However, whatever we believe HOPE is – God gives us hope too.



Hope enables us to look forward with expectation and confidence, placing our trust and faith in God'. Hope is open-ended, open to all possibilities and not limited by what we might wish for. Hope allows God to define our lives.

This highlights that 'hope' is different to 'want'. When we focus our longings on particular things, we limit the options that will satisfy us, and we ultimately find ourselves hemmed in with few possibilities. We tie ourselves up in our own hopelessness.

But when we let go and trust in God, we find the outcomes are wonderful, even when the way forward is not what we might have expected.

God has provided and continues to provide us with the things we need. Even in COVID times. He does this through scientists as they study the biology of viruses and the immune system and develop vaccines and treatments for the sick.
