Maths Extension

St Paul's has partnered with Grace Caboolture to deliver a Maths Extension program to selected Year 5 and 6 students. Mr Peter Jaunais, Head of Maths at Grace Caboolture and Rothwell, has designed a fantastic, hands on program where students are challenged to think outside of the box and apply a range of complex mathematical thinking and reasoning skills. The students were selected by classroom teachers and meet fortnightly for 45 mins. Last week, students had to estimate surface area and diameter by calculating the surface area of one piece of cardboard that would be put together to form a 3D sphere consisting of 30 pieces of cardboard.

INSIDE STORY: Year 1

Year 1 acknowledged **NADIOC** week. They listened to the story of the Rainbow Serpent and collaboratively created a Rainbow Serpent art work.

NAIDOC stands for **National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee**. Its origins can be traced to the emergence of Aboriginal groups in the 1920's which sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians.
