GRACE ALONE



Coming to the end of the year, where students are rewarded for their efforts, receive awards, recognition and reports. I came across this little reminder of God's grace, which is the Christian belief at the heart of the reformation and the story of Martin Luther. Note: Luther's logo The Luther Rose in the accompanying graphic, features this.

"When a person works an eight hour day and receives a fair day's pay for his or her time, that is a wage. When a person competes with an opponent and receives a trophy for his or her performance, that is a prize. When a person receives appropriate recognition for his or her long service or high achievements, that is an award. But when a person is not capable of earning a wage, can win no prize, and deserves not award – yet receives such a gift anyway – that is a good picture of God's unmerited favour. That's what we mean when we talk about the grace of God." (author unknown).
