Last Saturday I had the opportunity to head down to the Caboolture Netball Centre to watch 4 of our Year 6 netballers represent the GSP Blaze netball team in their division's Grand Final match. I am pleased to announce that they emerged 23-14 winners and I have since learnt that they have gone through the season undefeated - what an impressive performance girls! The GSP Netball Club has emerged and grown into a strong and thriving club within 4 years and I can recommend it to all our families who are considering netball for their child[ren] as a sporting option in 2021. Since announcing and introducing the "Straw no More Campaign" in Term 3, we have noticed a dramatic drop in the number of poppers being packed into lunch boxes - thank you for this! This in turn has resulted in fewer straws and straw wrappers being filtered through the rubbish bins at school. One family has shared with me how they have replaced poppers with small pre-mixed drink bottles for school and another has replaced plastic straws with bamboo straws for home use. Thank you for your ongoing support and the thought which has gone into this environmental initiative.

National Road Safety Week

Let's teach our kids road safety

From 15 to 22 November, it is National Road Safety Week - a time to remind our students how to be safe on and around roads. It is so important to teach our students how to travel safely to and from school each day, but we need your help. Please encourage your child to practice safe behaviours around roads. Our School Crossing Supervisors have some great tips to share on road safety with your children:

Always STOP, LOOK, LISTEN and THINK before crossing a road

Listen to the school crossing supervisor.

Only cross the street on the green 'walk' traffic sign or at a pedestrian crossing.

Explain traffic signs and signals with your child.

We also encourage you to get involved in committing to road safety by:

Drive slow around schools and obey the 40km/h speed limit.

Look out for children and school crossing supervisors entering the road.

Make sure all of your passengers are wearing a seatbelt.

The safety of our students is our highest priority and together we can make road safety top of mind.

INSIDE STORY: What'll happen to the Wattle?!!



Year 4 (with some extra assistance from Blake Witham), have recently been working on something special. They have submitted a video application to be one of 6 Queensland schools to be selected to receive Australian wattle seeds that have been studied in SPACE!

The selected schools around Australia will receive wattle seeds that have been flown to space as well as seeds that have not. The seeds are from the same seed lot. These seeds will be germinated and grown, with data being uploaded to the 'What'll happen to the wattle??!' app.

There will be teleconferences and other education support materials provided for the duration of the program. A small greenhouse, growing medium and all material will be provided to schools.

The project will take at least a year and it is envisaged that the wattle will then be planted and a map be made of all the 'space wattle trees' around Australia.

Please read below for the students reasons why their nomination should be chosen:

Our school should be chosen because we have lots of land space to plant the trees and enough space so everyone in our community can see it. Our school should get some seeds because we have a Kindy and a high school attached to it and an aged care centre close by. The wattles will feed birds, give us something else to look after and the wattle tree will help other plants, which need shade, to grow. People who love science will be able to study, make notes and share their information with the community. Our school is a clean environment. We learn about waste and carefully manage our waste so that we can care for the environment. We also have homes in the community close to our school and public places like an historic bike trail and a park nearby. We can plant the trees where the local community can see them and visit them. I think we should get the wattle seeds because the students in our school always take care of plants and we have a gardening club. Students in our school community participate in everything and we are very enthusiastic in everything we do as well!
