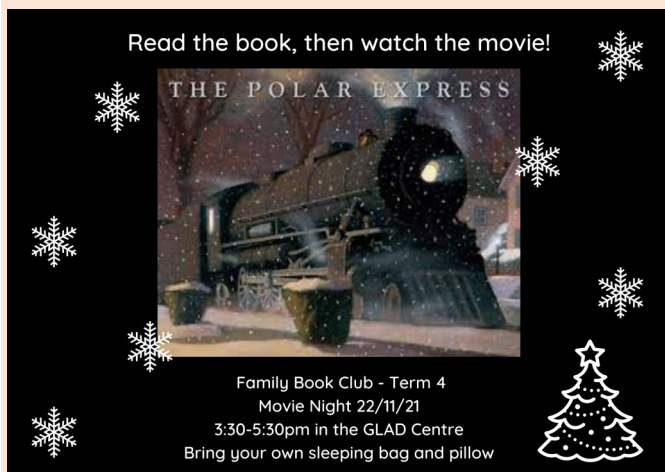
This weeks challenge: The Welsh name is Sion Corn, in German its Weihnachtsmann, in Norway its Julenisse. What is it in English?

CLASSROOM MUSIC

In Prep, Year 1 and Year 2, we are singing, playing and moving to music. Students are enjoying the games, rhymes and action songs. We are also exploring music literacy. Year 2 students are enjoying learning about different types of string instruments too.

In Year 3, we are singing and playing chime bars and composing and performing our Graphic Scores. Students are enjoying listening to and analysing, "In the Hall of the Mountain King" and "Morning Mood" from Greig's Peer Gynt Suite and learning the difference between Simple and Compound Time.



In Year 4 we are studying Prokofiev's "Peter and the Wolf", writing in staff notation, playing the glockenspiel and learning how to coordinate our voice and body by singing while tapping the beat in one hand and tapping the rhythm in the other hand.

In Year 5, we are playing the glockenspiel, writing melodies and learning about Beethoven's Choral Symphony, listening to different versions of his famous melody that was used for the hymn, Joyful Joyful, and the European National Anthem. The Year 5 string students performed their own version of Ode to Joy at the Twilight Recital last week. Games are still fun in Year 5 too!



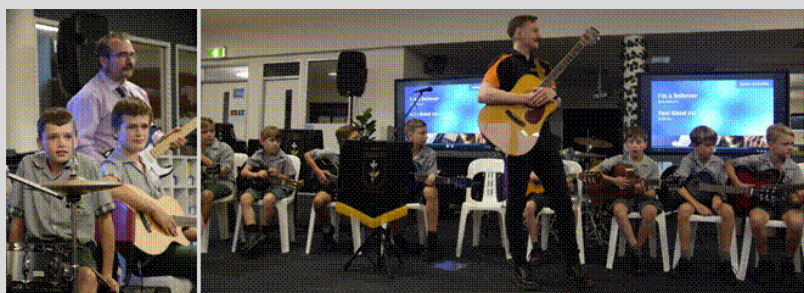
In Year 6 we are playing the ukulele and learning about popular song structure and Indigenous Pop Fusion Music.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION



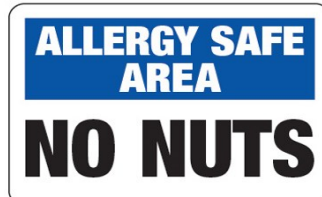
