They are a gift from heaven.



Moreton Bay Regional Council will be carrying out construction works beginning at the start of August. These works will be to extend the left turn lane from Smiths Road into Del Rosso Road. The north and south lanes of Smiths road will remain open however, there will be some traffic control measures in place during this time. Book Week is an annual event that highlights the importance of reading and draws on the joy of stories and the creativity of Australian books.


The theme this year is *Curious Creatures, Wild Minds*.

Book Blanket: Monday 24th August @ 8.45am. Year 6 students will be reading to a small group of Kindy to Year 5 students on picnic blankets.


Dress up Parade: Come dressed as a book character on Thursday 27th August @ 8.45am in the main undercover/grassed area (Kindy - Year 6).

INSIDE STORY: Junior Japanese

In Term 3, Japanese the Prep students have been learning about makiba (farm). This week students enjoyed creating a hitsuji \mathfrak{VOL} (sheep) craft and practiced writing in hiragana script.

Year 1 students are learning tenki てんき (weather) vocabulary. Our focus for this week was on the word 'kumori' which means cloudy. We also learnt how to ask the question, "tenki wa dou desu ka", which means, "How is the weather?" Students enjoyed making a 'kumori' craft to help remind them of their new vocabulary.

Year 2 students are learning katachi $b \not\sim b$ (shape) and iro VS (colour) vocabulary. This week students created katachi out of playdough, labelled them and made a Piccollage display.

Year 3 students are studying a tabemono t < t O (food) unit, with a specific focus on obentou boxes. Over the last few weeks we have been learning food vocabulary, meal etiquette, practiced how to use chopsticks, how to

say thank you for the food and how to say I eat (food o tabemasu) and I drink (drink o nomimasu).










Book Week Competition
