Dear Parents and Caregivers

Welcome to eSmart Week at St Paul's. Annually this week provides us with the opportunity to revisit and reinforce the critically important message of using, being responsible and staying safe online whether it's at school or at home. Our eSmart School Leaders will be at the forefront of sharing tips, strategies and ideas on using technology safely. Thank you to our eSmart Committee, led by Mrs. Cottrell, Mrs. Witham and Miss Cross, for organizing a week of fun activities which include an eSmart Competition, Art activities, an accessory day and presentations by the eSmart School leaders.



One of the many positive outcomes which have emerged from Distance Learning has been the "Straw No More" campaign. This was initiated by one of our Year 3 students, Bella W, who on her own, during Term 2, investigated the impact of plastic straws on the ocean and the environment in general. Last week Friday the school signed the "Forever Pledge" at our two school assemblies held on the day. Our aim is to educate our school community to reduce the use of plastic straws both at school and within your home environment. Our school audit showed that juice Poppers from home is the number source of plastic straw use at St Paul's. We aren't asking you to stop buying or supplying juice for your child at school anymore, but to look at an alternative juice storage option for your child. We will also be reminding and encouraging the student body to use paper, aluminum, glass, bamboo or silicone straws instead of plastic straws. Thank you in advance for your input and support in this matter. We would also love to hear your thoughts and ideas on this great environmental initiative.

Last week Friday we celebrated Learning Assistant Day at St Paul's. This was done with a special morning tea and a small gift from both the P&F and school as a token of our appreciation and recognition for the significant part which our LAs play in every day school life. St Paul's has always implemented a philosophy of investing additional human resources, as part of the face-to-face interaction and daily support, in all our learning spaces. Our goal is to keep children safe from bullying, cyber bullying and violence. eSmart is a way to achieve this. https://www.esmart.org.au/


PHYSICAL EDUCATION
