## What if God was one of us?

Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you and praise your name, for in perfect faithfulness you have done wonderful things, things planned long ago. (verse 1)

On her 1996 album, *Relish*, Joan Osborne sung that hit song, 'One of Us'. The question: "What if God was one of us?" was the catch line that hit a chord among the listening population at the time. It is a good question even now, particularly at Christmas time: What if God was one of us?

If God was one of us, what would that really mean? If God was actually one of us human beings, what would he look like? What would be his name and would it be okay with him to call him that name to his face?

God is one of us. God is Jesus of Nazareth, the very Son of God giving up his life for you and offering to give you his full life of meaning, calling, love and peace this Christmas.

#### Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Together with their parents, the Year 6 students will also attend a Graduation Dinner, Service and Awards Night next week on Monday. Tomorrow we will be graduating our littlest St Paul's students when the Kindergarten hosts their Graduation Service. We look forward to receiving and welcoming these youngest students and their families into our school next year. A huge shout out needs to go to the teaching and administration teams who have been and continue to work behind the scenes to make these events flow smoothly. I am looking forward to seeing many of you and celebrating with you as a family over the coming week.

Feedback from the swimming instructors has been very positive about how the children were engaged in the program and made great progress in their water awareness and skill development. Thank you parents for your support in packing and checking swimming bags every day as well as encouraging your child to keep persevering in this program. Thank you too, to the Prep – Year 2 staff for your role in supporting the students in your care through this fortnight of changed routines and learning programs.

Last week Mrs. Shirley Crispe, our OSHC Service Leader, informed my office that she will be retiring at the end of the year to focus on her family, health and enjoying a slower pace of life. Shirley will be thanked at a closing staff event for her time, dedication and commitment to the OSHC Program at St Paul's. Together with QLECS [Queensland Lutheran Early Childhood Services] a process is now underway to recruit and appoint a new Service Leader. 
If you visit the school, please do not forget to complete a COVID form at the front desk.
