Dear Parents and Caregivers,

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Tomorrow, at Chapel, we will observe Ash Wednesday, which marks 40 days till Good Friday and Easter. Students will be invited to have a small cross, marked with ash / charcoal, on the back of their hand. Why is it "Ash Wednesday"? Ash is all that remains after life has been destroyed. Totally destroyed. Look at ashes, and you must think of what has been destroyed, and what destroyed it. On Ash Wednesday, many who follow Jesus wear a mark of ash, a cross, to symbolize how we will



follow Jesus to discover how he intends to deal with everything that destroys life.

Early in the Gospels, we read about Jesus spending 40 days alone in the wilderness. This was a testing time for him, in which he needed to sort out whether or not he was up to the challenges coming his way, the Cross of Good Friday in particular. Ash Wednesday is about challenging ourselves to follow Jesus, all the way to that moment he gives his life for us.

Back on the road, they set out for Jerusalem. Jesus had a head start on them, and they were following, puzzled and not just a little afraid. He took the Twelve and began again to go over what to expect next. "Listen to me carefully. We're on our way up to Jerusalem. When we get there, the Son of Man will be betrayed to the religious leaders and scholars. They will sentence him to death. Then they will hand him over to the Romans, who will mock and spit on him, give him the third degree, and kill him. After three days he will rise alive." Mark 10:32-34

If you and your family would appreciate another opportunity to observe this significant day in the Christian calendar, you are welcome to our service at 7pm, on Ash Wednesday.

Short Term Planning Cycles

Last week, teaching teams in Years 1-6 met with Learning Support and myself to discuss current student learning needs and goals in English. For the first Short Term Cycle from Weeks 4-6, the year levels will be studying the following:

- Year 1 Lynley Dodd books (CVC words, phonics, sharing ideas and listening to others).
- Year 2 Sentence construction, using the 'Sentence Train'.
- Year 3 Exploring the theme of 'worries' through Fiction and Non-Fiction texts, constructing sentences.
- Year 4 'Tom Weakley' books by Tristian Banks, 'Anything Goes' writing, sentence construction.
- Year 5 'Wonder' novel study, understanding characters' perspectives, feelings and reactions.
- Year 6 'Cyclone Tracy' novel study, 'See, Think, Wonder' framework.
