FROM THE HEAD OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

Our second Short-Term Planning Cycle is currently being delivered during English lessons across Years 1-6.

The areas of focus for each year level is as follows:

- Year 1: Comparing Fiction and Non-Fiction animal-themed texts. Phonological Awareness.
- Year 2: Wombat Stew text study. Sentence construction.
- Year 3: Persuasive Writing. Sentence construction.
- Year 4: Enhancing writing with great vocabulary. Anything Goes Writing. Sentence construction.
 - Year 5: Exploring identity through a 'Wonder' novel study. Understanding characters' feelings, reactions and perspectives.
- Year 6: 'Cyclone Tracy' novel study using 'See, Think, Wonder' and 'Zoom In' frameworks. Journal entries from a particular perspective.

INSIDE STORY: INQUIRY SKILLS IN THE GLAD CENTRE

Prep students have been looking at the alphabet, book handling, print directionality, parts of a book, letters, words and sentences.



Year 1 are learning how to find information in a non-fiction book. They are examining the contents, index page and looking at text features (e.g., maps

and diagrams) and how these help the reader make sense of what they are reading.

Year 2 have been identifying the differences between fiction and non-fiction texts. They are learning that different types of texts have specific text features.

The Senior students have focused on plagiarism and understand that when researching they must put information into their own words. They have also been revising how to write references for books and websites and how to organise these into a Bibliography or Reference list.

Moving forward, items will only be kept for 12 months. Anything donated in Terms 1-3 of the previous year will be offered back or disposed of.


