John 21:7-14

7Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, "It is the Lord," he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. 8The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards. 9When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread.

10Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." 11So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn. 12Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. 13Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. 14This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Reflection: John recognises who the person on the shore is and declares, 'It is the Lord.' Yet again, Peter responds impulsively, dressing and jumping into the water, and going straight to Jesus. The others are left to do the hard work of dragging in the heavy load of fish. When they get there, they see a fire has been lit and a meal is being cooked in preparation for eating together. This simple seaside gathering shows Jesus inviting his disciples to be with him and to be strengthened and renewed by him.

Earlier, Jesus had commissioned this motley crew to be the people who would continue his mission. They were to be his 'sent ones' and they were blessed with the Holy Spirit to fulfil that call. Here they are gathered again, sharing in a meal. Since Jesus' first resurrection appearances, they have had to get used to the fact that he wasn't always physically with them (this is only the third time). In the future, they will have to continue the mission by being with Jesus in prayer and by being strengthened by word, sacrament and the Holy Spirit.

That is our situation as well. We too are his 'sent ones' and we too need to be with him in prayer. We too need to be strengthened, guided and renewed by word, sacrament and the Holy Spirit, as we seek to represent and serve him.

Prayer: *Living Lord Jesus, help us to know your presence today. Strengthen and renew us by your written word and the Holy Spirit in our hearts, as we seek to be your sent ones today. Amen.*

I would like to wish every family a safe Term 2 as together we embrace the many opportunities and learning experiences awaiting us over the coming 10 weeks.



NAPLAN

Teachers are now studying the information handbook on the tests which will take place for students in Year 3 and 5 in Weeks 4-5. Teachers endeavour to make this experience as stress free as possible and we ask that parents support us in this. Running up to the tests, students will be prepared for the tests, by doing the practice activities provided for this purpose. At St Paul's, we teach the curriculum and do not teach specifically towards the tests. We believe that this is still the best way for children to do well by having a rich range of learning skills across curriculum areas. In preparing your child for the tests, the best approach is to just encourage them to do their best. Make sure that they are not tired and give them encouragement and support. It is essential that students arrive at school no later than 8.15am each morning to ensure plenty of time to set up and settle before tests begin. See this as simply another step along the road on their learning journey. Any parents with concerns regarding their child sitting the test should contact our Learning Support teachers. The tests are valuable for our teachers as they provide concrete data that is useful for evaluation and planning. Ultimately, that helps all our students. NAPLAN results will be available to parents later in the year.

Music Showcase

The Semester 1 Showcase will take place on **Tuesday 27 April 2021** in the Chapel, commencing at 6:00pm. The students have been preparing music to present at the Showcase and this is a wonderful performance opportunity for them. The String Ensemble, Year 2 Violin, Rock Band and St Paul's Choir will be performing, along with students presenting a variety of items playing brass, woodwind, strings, guitar and piano. Students are required to **arrive at the Chapel at 5:30pm** with their **INSTRUMENT AND MUSIC**, wearing their **FORMAL SCHOOL UNIFORM**. This allows time to mark the roll, tune instruments, warm up, and check stage placement before the showcase commences at 6:00pm. I encourage you and your family to attend this event to support your child, and all of the performers, in their musical endeavours.



Robotics Club

Students will explore programming and learn how to use our great technology resources like Spheros.



Reading Initiative

This Term, St Paul's students will be offered the opportunity to engage in a range of activities each term in relation to a specific theme. The theme for Term 2 is 'READ - THINK'. Mrs Morris and I have been busy creating the program and initiative and Mrs Morris will release details at the beginning of the term. Students who complete the set of challenges will be eligible for a special St Paul's wrist band with the theme words printed on it. This wrist band can be worn during all of 2021 as part of the everyday school uniform. We hope to encourage a love of reading and exploring texts in our Library through the initiative.

Borrowing Library Books

It has come to my attention that we still have a number of students who are not borrowing Library books. 15 mins per night of reading is compulsory across our school and we allocate borrowing time each week for students to self-select texts of interest to take home. It is an expectation across our school that students borrow at least one book per fortnight. If your child has consistently not borrowed, Mrs Morris will begin sending a letter home to inform parents. The purpose of this letter to inform you as a family of a pattern that we are noticing and to encourage your child to borrow one book per fortnight in their area of interest. Please have a discussion with your child about the types of books that they might be interested in reading and borrowing from our school GLAD Centre.

Thursday: Year 4, 5 and 6




The school library bag or a cloth bag is required to be used for borrowing. If your child is absent or forgets their library bag our GLAD Centre is open for student borrowing at the following times:
