Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13).

These words were the focal point of last week's Anzac Day Chapel. Jesus is the ultimate role model of such self sacrificing love. It led him to put his life on the line, concerned only for the welfare of others and providing for the needs of others ahead of his own. His love for us ultimately cost him his life. When I place the example of Christ alongside the example of an ANZAC such as John Simpson, the hero who used his donkey as an ambulance for wounded soldiers at Gallipoli, I find that both help me appreciate in a deeper way the sacrifice of the other. For 24 days, Simpson risked his own life 10-15 times a day, trudging up Shrapnel Gully in the face of almost constant enemy fire, in order to bring back that number of seriously wounded soldiers, who, without his efforts, would no doubt have died. And on the 24th day, he lost his own life, while he was engaged in his normal routine of saving others.



Prayer: Jesus, our observance of Anzac day helped us appreciate the meaning your self sacrifice. Teach us, through your words and actions to learn the way of peace. May your peace be a real force in our world where people are so easily lead to fight each other. Teach us also to appreciate that such self sacrifice gives us the freedom and privileges we have so much of here in Australia. Amen.

INSIDE STORY: RISE

This term the Years 4-6 RISE students are undertaking an entrepreneurial project based on the show and concept Shark Tank. Students are working in teams to develop a product with an environmental, educational or health and fitness perspective.

The steps within the project can be seen here:

As students progress with their project and complete tasks such as making their prototype and developing their advertisement, they are using their skills to show different roles within the project. Your project must have an educational or environmental or health focus.

The Shark Tank Challenge

- Brainstorm a Product to Fulfill a NeedCreate a Prototype of the Product
- Create a Print Advertisement for the Product
- Refine the Prototype and make it Look Great
- Create a Storyboard and Plan for a Commercial



Collaborative Team Members

You may share these jobs in any way you like. They do not have to be exclusive to one team member.

Art and Quality Control: Advises, films, and directs commercial. Creates print advertisement. Makes sure products meet rubric minimums. Adds art work and design elements to prototype.

<u>Promotions</u>: Plans and delivers the product pitch in the shark tank. Determines advertisement content both print advertisements and commercials. Develops commercial story board.

<u>Product Development</u>: Creates prototype of product. Creates and secures props and scenery for the commercial. Next week we descend on the Makerspace to start our models or prototypes. Students will be making their first pitch to another class within the school and depending on how successful this pitch is their advertising budget will be determined.

Year 4s finished planning today and Year 5 and 6 will finalise the first phase this week.

There are some seriously good ideas being developed and many of them could legitimately compete on the real Shark Tank Show. Watch this space for patents pending.
