Our Year 3 students will be participating in the 9.00am church service this coming Sunday 24 October. You are welcome to join us for this.


Next Tuesday will see our 2022 Preps visit for their Prep Orientation morning.



Very wet and slippery conditions last Friday at the Sports Gala Day. Boys AFL and Touch Football demonstrated great team work and skill on the field.


