The Habit of Quality

Aristotle once said, "Quality is not an act, it is a habit.' It is the conscious choice to focus one's efforts and attentions to bring about the most optimal result possible.

Now as parents our idea of quality effort may differ from our child's perspective. We may be looking for quality through how clean their rooms are, how neatly their workbooks are laid out, or how well they perform on their report card. Our children, on the other hand, may be looking at how beautiful their Minecraft mansion is, how aesthetic their 'vibe is in their room' or how long their win streak was on their favourite game.



What I love, is that all these things show a deliberate decision to put thought, effort, and skillful execution towards a task... (perhaps just not always the task we as parents want ©).

As we work with our young people to develop the value of quality, my encouragement to you is to see quality in your child's area of focus first. Ask them about their latest Minecraft creation. Delight in the latest dance they have created and marvel at the cool soccer trick they have perfected. In doing so, use the language of quality to encourage them. For example, 'That was brilliant. I have watched you practice that skill over and over again, and now you've got it! All of that hard work has paid off and I am so proud of you.' Or perhaps you might say, 'Wow, is that the same mansion Minecraft mansion you were working on yesterday? It looks incredible. I love how you have carefully placed each of those blocks around the waterfall. You have worked so patiently on that. Well done!'

At these times it is often so tempting to add, 'I wish you worked that hard on your homework too', but my encouragement is just to let them sit in your positive words of encouragement. In these moments, you are planting the seed of love, developing their understanding of quality effort and providing them with positive affirmation.



They will remember these special times and more importantly, they will be learning the benefits of their focused attention, patience and skilful efforts, and this will have a flow on effect into their lives.

Changes to our Newsletter

Throughout the later part of 2021, our staff have been working hard with a new service provider to develop a new digital format for our newsletter. It is our hope that this format will be user friendly and provide some useful metrics for the school to allow us to review and enhance our processes. At this stage we expect our new format to be ready to launch in the next few weeks, so keep and eye out for something new.

To coincide with our new format, we will now be moving to a fortnightly newsletter in 2022. Each new newsletter will be made available to families in Week 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10 of each term (even weeks) and will continue to be available to families on Tuesday of each week. 


Students bringing toys and equipment to school

Behaviour Education

Towards the end of 2021, we introduced an outline of the expectations of student behaviour at St Paul's. Please see attached. This has become known as the Behaviour Ladder and as one student commented when it was introduced to her class, "It's a ladder you don't really want to climb". It incorporates the language of the Play is the Way Program that we use at school for social and emotional development. You will see the term Kaizen Class being used on it. This is when a child will be sent to another classroom to take a break from their own classroom environment, gather their thinking and hopefully return ready to work. Kaizen is a Japanese word meaning; a method for transforming habits one step at a time in order to continuously improve. Each year level will be introduced to this over the next few weeks. HEAD OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

Read Write Inc

Our school is very excited to be adopting a more systematic approach to teaching our students how to read and write. The program that we are adopting from the start of the 2022 year is called 'Read Write Inc'. This program is something that all teachers and most learning assistants received training in through a whole day workshop in January. Our teachers and learning assistants will then have access to ongoing professional learning throughout the year and we will have a face to face training yearly to refine our skills to ensure the best outcomes for all students.



Your child will learn to read in a very simple way. He or she will learn to:

- 1. Read letters by their 'sounds'
- 2. Blend these sounds into words
- 3. Read the words in a story

Mathematics

At St Paul's we are passionate about teaching your children well so that your child has a deep understanding of the content and can apply their learning to a range of real-life contexts. Since Term 4 last year, our teachers have been engaging in professional learning through Stanford University. Our teachers have been learning more about what the latest research and neuroscience tells us about how students best learn in Mathematics. Using a framework of 'Big Ideas' students will start to delve deeper into Mathematics investigations where they will problem solve, collaborate, explain their thinking, try out ideas, make mistakes and reflect on other ways to approach a problem.
