Furthermore, our students unleashed their curiosity at Questacon, travelled up mountains, remembered fallen heroes at the Australian War Memorial, met members of the St George Illawarra Dragons and had their belongings signed, spent time together in community, demonstrated grit and courage and represented our school so very well.

To top it all off, our students were invited to be a part of the welcoming party for our Prime Minister - Anthony Albanese, and his special guest, the Prime Minister of Samoa - Fiame Naomi Mataafa. There was an 18-cannon salute, a guard of honour, the official signing of documents, fist bumps and handshakes to go around. They were then treated to a special meeting with Terry Young MP - Federal Member for Longman who joined our students for their electoral role play. 
The Australian Government identifies the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the National Capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government has contributed funding of \$90 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards these costs.

The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and has already been passed through to families through a reduction in the camp charge at the time of calculation. As a school, we are thankful to current and past Governments for continuing to emphasise the importance of this camp experience and for providing this rebate to our families to assist student

attendance.













Pastor Mike - Devotion

VIOLET - In chapel, you will notice a lot of the colour violet hanging around. This colour features for the forty days that lead up to Good Friday and Easter. Violet is the colour of royalty. Jesus was called a King. But the people calling him a King were making fun of him, mocking him. When Jesus was arrested, he suffered terrible abuse. A crown of thorns was just part of it. And a fake purple robe. So, violet has also become the colour of Jesus' suffering. We sometimes call this the Passion of Christ, a term that comes from the Greek "pathos", which means "suffering". Can you see this word in "sympathy"? When we sympathise or empathise with others, we try to somehow get close to the person suffering, showing understanding and sensitivity, even though we can't possibly feel the pain that the other is suffering.

This is something we need to appreciate and take on board in the 40 days leading to Easter. In most Christian churches, this is known as the season of Lent.

"Christ suffered once for us all" (1 Peter 3:18). You may well know someone who is suffering terribly right now. It could be you. As we realise that Jesus suffered for us, and because of us, it could be that we start to appreciate that he really does have a very deep appreciation of what we are suffering. More than that, his suffering save us.

Prayer: "Jesus, help us appreciate the suffering you went through. For us and because of us. Let this have an amazing impact on the way we react whenever we notice the many places in our world and our community where people are suffering."
