That's "Church" for Fletcher, and is a great little illustration of what "Church" is meant to be. Jesus says, "Let children come to me" (Luke 18:16). It's a continuing coming and going, coming to the One who keeps us safe, helps us grow, and provides for us in a world that can be such a dangerous
