There are moments where a memorable movie quote, inspirational speaker or even comedian can stir something in you that resonates and becomes a lifelong lesson.

- "Why do we fall, Bruce? So we can learn to pick ourselves up again": Thomas Wayne to young Bruce in Batman Begins **Resilience**
- "With great power, comes great responsibility": Uncle Ben to Peter Parker in Spiderman Responsibility
- "You're the best around, nothing's going to ever keep you down": (from Karate Kid movie) Joe Esposito **Self Confidence**
- "Attitude is a little thing that makes a big difference": Sir Winston Churchill Attitude

A positive attitude and an open mind makes a good start to any endeavour. Without these, any task has instant obstacles. If we look at all the things we put in our own way from time to time, its probably confronting. How quick are we to blame someone else? It's not my fault? It's not mine, so I shouldn't have to clean it up. I can't be bothered, I'll do it later, or I'll do it tomorrow. All too often we make excuses when all we need is positivity to overcome the obstacles that we may have placed there ourselves. It's normal to think like this, right?

But we want to motivate and inspire our children to be better and achieve success. Well that starts with letting go a little. Now, this is sometimes hard to do, even when we are determined to hold back and not rescue. "Dad can you open this bottle for me?" A simple and harmless request, but where is the learning if I do it for them every time they ask?

In an article written by Positive Psychologist, Dr Justin Colson, he states, "Never regularly do for a child the things a child can do for him or herself." – Goal: **Independence**

Dr Colson proposes "When you muck up, you make up." – The goal of **Accountability.**

He observes, "kids of all ages will make mistakes. In fact, mucking up is part of the learning process. But kids will just repeat their mistakes unless they experience the consequences of their decisions. The use of behavioural consequences is a way of teaching children to take greater responsibility for their lives and to learn to make smarter choices".

Allowing our young ones to start being independent, to make choices for themselves and learn which ones help them succeed and which ones result in consequence. Making mistakes is all part of it too. 'Mistakes are proof that you are trying'. Lets make sure we allow lots of those and embrace them.

Independence-building is vitally important for parents. It's the pathway to children's competency, confidence and creativity, and the short cut to resilience and real learning.

At St Paul's, we believe that every challenge is an opportunity to grow and that with perseverance and the right mindset, anything is possible! To begin a new year of learning, I want to shine a light on the importance of persistence and a growth mindset in our students' learning journeys.

What is a Growth Mindset?

A growth mindset is the belief that abilities and intelligence can be developed through hard work, dedication, and learning from mistakes. Students with a growth mindset understand that challenges are not roadblocks but stepping stones toward success. Instead of feeling discouraged by difficulties, they embrace them and learn from the experience.

Why Persistence Matters

Persistence is the key to overcoming obstacles. It's about sticking with something even when it's tough, and not giving up when things don't go as planned. Whether it is mastering a tricky maths problem, editing a piece of writing, or trying something new, persistence allows students to push through challenges and keep improving.

How Can We Foster Persistence and a Growth Mindset?

Celebrate Effort: We strive to encourage children to focus on their effort and progress, rather than the outcome. We acknowledge the hard work they've put in, regardless of the result.

Embrace Mistakes: Mistakes are a natural part of learning! When students make mistakes, it's an opportunity for them to learn and grow. At St Paul's we strive to teach students that failure isn't something to fear, but a valuable part of the process.

Model a Growth Mindset: As adults, we can show students that we too are learning and growing. By sharing our own experiences with persistence and learning from setbacks, we set an example they can follow.

Celebrating Growth at School

We are committed to helping our students develop a growth mindset and learn the value of persistence in all aspects of their lives. Throughout the year, we will continue to encourage students to embrace challenges, persist through difficulties, and celebrate their growth, no matter how big or small.


Let's continue to work together to foster a positive, resilient attitude in our students.

Welcome to an exciting year with Arts @ St Paul's! Music-making exercises the brain as well as the body, and getting involved in music ensembles gives students the chance to learn how to express themselves and to connect with others in amazing ways. Here's how your child can be involved:

- SENIOR CHOIR (Yr3-6): Rehearsals are held every Thursday morning (7:30-8:15am) unless otherwise advised.
- JUNIOR VOICES (Yr1-2): Rehearsals are held every Thursday First Break (10:45am) unless otherwise advised. Prep students will be invited to join in Term 4.
- STRINGS IMMERSION PROGRAM (Yr 3): All Year 3 students are involved in this program. Instruments: Violin, Viola, Guitar, Ukulele.
- PRIVATE INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS (Yr 2-6): 30-minute individual or group lessons in piano, flute, guitar, bass, ukulele, drums, violin, viola, cello, double bass subject to availability. Fee-paying.


From Chappy
